AMVETS Post 1 and The Living War Memorial Park

A bit of History of the Living War Memorial of 1952:

The Young Men's Business Club founded the Living War Memorial Park to honor those soldiers both living and dead who perished in WWI (162 soldiers) and in WWI 760 soldiers who lived or are living in Pierce County, WA.

Many thanks to Harold A. WOODWORTH (Woodworth & Company) who made it a reality by donating his property on the south end of the east side of the Narrows Bridge after the citizens of Tacoma and Pierce County approved the memorial plans.

Harold handed the quit claim¹ deed over to Mayor John H. Anderson on behalf of the city on February 4, 1951. The Young Men's Business Club wanted to dedicate this new park on Veterans Day in 1952, yet there was a lot of work to do.

Word got out and nearly "every civic, fraternal, service and military organization in the city was represented on various committees that saw the work completed." All the construction materials and labor were donated. Even President Eisenhower donated to this cause!!

Inside the Living War Memorial Park, where the people gathered for that Armistice Day dedication there is a 6' square of Wilkeson Sandstone which is in the center of a stone monument 20 foot long. This was "constructed entirely by volunteer labor from the Bricklayers and Hod Carriers Union" in 1952."²

The SANDSTONE INSCRIPTION says:

DEDICATED TO HONORED MEMORY OF THOSE WHO GAVE THEIR LIVES FOR OUR COUNTRY, 1952

The Living War Memorial was dismantled in 2003 for the construction of the second additional Narrows Bridge. It eventually was moved to the New WAR MEMORIAL Park located at 624 Myers St, Tacoma, WA. 98406

AMVETS DONATION to The LIVING WAR MEMORIAL

We, AMVETS POST 1 OF TACOMA, Washington are proud to announce to the public that after 69 years it has been discovered that our veteran predecessors, had donated the U.S.S. Tacoma (C-18) (PG-32) (CL-20) Denver Cruiser's ships bell of 1903 to the Living War Memorial.

Also, we found out that our AMVETS 3rd Vice Commander at that time, John C. Migdula, had been appointed to the War Memorial Association on Sept 28th, 1952, just two months before the Living War Memorial's dedication.

What happened to the U.S.S. Tacoma Cruiser ship?

The U.S.S. Tacoma ran aground just before dawn on January 16, 1924 on the Blanquilla Reef in attempting to enter Vera Cruz Harbor in Mexico during heavy seas. "The Blanquilla reef is outside the Vera Cruz breakwater, (16 miles away) directly opposite the city. It is a small submerged reef and on it is situated a lighthouse." "That morning they were hit with a hurricane," waves began breaking over the decks where the crew was obtaining life rafts. Captain Sparrow sent two hundred and thirty-two sailors ashore and keeping a total of fifty men on board." That afternoon a second hurricane hit, forcing them below deck. Sometime later, Captain Sparrow and four radiomen went out to the gun deck to check on the ships condition and to make a radio call for help.

The next morning after the storm had somewhat subsided, they had located the lieutenant and the chief radioman halfconscious in a hammock netting. In an adjacent netting were two radiomen, crushed to death. The Captain and the other radioman were missing. Their radio shack had been washed away. Captain Sparrow's body was located later wedged under some lockers on the main deck.

The total list of the men who perished are: Captain Herbert G. Sparrow (Cleveland, Ohio), Radioman 1c; Homer H. Lussiner (Bristol, Connecticut); Radioman 2c; Edward T. Herrick (Massachusetts) and Radioman 3c; Solomon Sivin (New York).

The wrecked ship was then sold and the USS Tacoma bell was placed into storage on Mare Island, Calif. After a two-year silence, the USS Tacoma Ships Bell had been mounted in front of the regimental headquarters building at the Naval Training Station at San Diego, California.

How did the Bell get to Tacoma AMVETS?

There have not been any records discovered to date that reveal how Tacoma AMVETS gained possession of the Ships Bell. There was a Navy Lieutenant L.C. Bloom who was a member of the War Memorial Association, but how the Bell traveled to Tacoma from San Diego is still unknown. The records search continues.

AMVETS of Tacoma Bell Inscription

Working with Jennifer S. Hines, from the City of Tacoma, from April 2021 through summer 2021 she approved AMVETS to have Premier Monuments do the engraving onto that sandstone plaque of 1952. It is right behind the display of the U.S.S. Tacoma's 1903 ships bell.

Our inscription reads:

IN MEMORY OF THEIR SACRIFICE AMVETS OF TACOMA DONATED THEIR SHIP'S BELL

This inscription was completed on October 14, 2021.
