Yuletide Beliefs, Customs Come from Many Groups

Few Americans are aware that the Puritans of New England outlawed both the religious observance and social celebration of Christmas for a number of years, many early colonists did not share their anti-Christmas attitudes, and in the areas around New York, Pennsylvania and the southern colonies, both religious and folk celebrations became customary during the 17th and 18th centuries.

Colonists from England, Holland and Germany stressed eating, family gatherings, merry making and joyousness during the Christmas season, which usually began in early December and ran into January.

ABOUT THAT STABLE

Perhaps the most authentic duplication of the first manger scene was that prepared by St. Francis of Assisi in the year 1200.

The Stable of
Bethlehem did not in any
way resemble the
elaborate and decorative
scenes which we see about
us today, with greenery,
bright lights, and plaster of
Paris animals and adoring
shepherds.

There was no room in the inn that night so Jesus was born in a stable: a crude shelter hewn into a rocky ledge of the Judean countryside. It was cold, dark, damp, and bare of ornaments.

With our many modern conveniences of today, we find it hard to imagine that weary Judean travelers often spent the night in such caves, welcoming rather than disdaining joint tenancy with beasts because the breath of the cattle and the heat of their bodies provided a little warmth.

The cave which was the birthplace of the Savior is now a grotto beneath Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity and though fascinated by the simplicity of the original Nativity scene, Christianity has still embellished it with comfort and ornamentation.

The yule-log custom was imported from England, and England settlers contributed mince pies and plum pudding to the Christmas dinner.

The English also brought their customs of decorating houses and building with ivy, holly and mistletoe although Christmas gifts were not emphasized by early colonists.

Caroling, a Christmas folk practice which became popular quickly in the colonies, was immediately adopted by many groups. Carols included religious and folk songs which had grown up about the season.

CHRISTMAS TREE

The Germans who settled in PA. brought the Christmas tree custom and German children

decorated their trees with animal cookies, apples, colored paper and strings of popcorn.


The southern custom of setting off firecrackers and shooting guns at Christmas is recorded in a passage from the Wilmington (N.C.) Daily Journal, Dec. 23, 1851:

"....Our town authorities on Christmas generally let the boys have their way so far as mere noise is concerned. There was therefore much firing of crackers, rockets, sarpients, etc., and a good deal of cheering and shouting....."

These beliefs, symbols and customs started in the colonies between 1620 and the middle 1800's. By informal means they filtered throughout the various areas and between 1800 and 1860 both the religious and folk aspects of Christmas had diffused widely.

Each section of the country developed a Christmas celebration which reflected its local culture, national background, and natural environment.
