Life Membership Dues

Whereas AMVETS life membership dues have been set at \$250 since January 2012, and,

Whereas this is among the lowest price for life membership dues of any Veterans Service Organization, and,

Whereas this does not accurately reflect the value of AMVETS life membership, no, therefore,

Be it resolved that Article VII, Section 6, a, (1) be replaced with the following:

"Life membership dues, effective September 1, 2023, shall be not less than \$500 for those members age up to and including 55, ages 56 through and including 65 will be \$400 and those 66 and over \$300, nonrefundable, and payable to the post, of which 50 percent shall be forwarded to National Headquarters and 25 percent to the state department."

THE AMERICAN'S CREED Drawn from Our Political Classics

A t the request of a number of our readers, we are glad to reprint the American's Creed, written by William Tyler Page, to which was recently awarded the prize of \$1,000.00 offered by the city of Baltimore for the best expression of American political faith. The Creed was printed in the EVENING PUBLIC LEDGER on April 10th:

THE AMERICAN'S CREED

I believe in the United States of America as a government of the people, by the people for the people; whose just powers are derived from the consent of the governed; a democracy in a republic; a sovereign nation of many sovereign States; a perfect union, on and inseparable, established upon those principles of freedom, equality, justice and humanity for which American patriots sacrificed their lives and fortunes.

I therefore believe it is my duty to my country to love it; to support its Constitution; to obey its laws; to respect its flag and to defend it against all enemies.

The Creed is based upon the classic pronouncements of American political and patriotic doctrine, as may be seen by the following:

KEY TO THE AMERICAN'S CREED

First. "I believe in the United States of America." See Preamble to the Constitution of the United States.

Second. "As a government of the people by the people, for the people." Preamble to the Constitution: Daniel Webster's speech in the Senate January 26, 1830; Abraham Lincoln's speech at Gettysburg, 1962. Third. "Whose just powers are derived from the consent of the governed." Declaration of Independence.

Fourth. "A democracy in a republic." Madison in the Federalist, No. 10: Article 10, Amendments to the Constitution.

Fifth. "A sovereign nation of many sovereign States." Great Seal of the United States; Article 4, Constitution of the United States.

Sixth. "A perfect union." Constitution of the United States. Seventh. "One and inseparable." Webster's speech in the Senate, January 26, 1930.

Eighth. "Established upon those principles of freedom,

equality, justice and humanity." Declaration of Independence. Ninth. "For which American patriots," Lincoln's Gettysburg speech.

Tenth. "Sacrificed their lives and fortunes." Declaration of Independence.

Eleventh. "I therefore believe it is my duty to my country to love it." Edward Everett Hale's "The Man Without a Country."

Twelfth. "To support its Constitution." Oath of Allegiance, Section 1757. Revised Statutes of the United States.

Thirteenth. "To obey its laws." Washington's farewell address; Article 6, Constitution of United States.

Fourteenth. "To respect its flag." ARMY and NAVY Regulations: War Department Circular on Flag Etiquette, April 14, 1917; National Anthem, the "Star Spangled Banner."

Fifteenth. "And to defend it against all enemies." Oath of Allegiance.
